## **Education Director's Report**

As we close out another year, I want to express how grateful I am to be in a position focused on contributing to help our students near and far. I am happy to say that our student count went up this year, and participation has increased, along with the help of our supportive and passionate staff members. We have been working hard to meet students where they're at through our services, and we have a lot more strategic planning built into this new year to enhance our capacity.

Here are some other meetings and activities we have accomplished this past month:

- Nov. 6 Attended Indigenous Authors Panel hosted by the Arizona Humanities program.
- Nov. 13 Attended the TEDNA (Tribal Education Department National Association) Board meeting.
- Nov. 14 Met with the MCSD Title VI Coordinator, Mercedes Krause, to discuss further strategies for seeking input from students, family, and community members for the new year. PAC (Parent Advisory Committee meeting was held that evening at 6:00 p.m. with the MCSD Superintendent.)
- **Nov. 14** Hosted Student Recognition Night for 1st Quarter awardees from Schurz Elementary School at the regular Tribal Council meeting.
- Nov. 19 Presented 2025 Tax Fund Use Plan request before the Tax Commission.
- **Nov. 22** Attended the Indian Education Advisory Committee (under the Nevada Indian Commission) to provide updates on the Tribe activities and get informed about where planning is heading for 2025.
- Nov. 22 I met with the NV Department of Education and Paiute Language Instructor, E'Sha Hoferer, to discuss further strategies to advance our NYCP plan to support a dual credit enrollment process for the students taking Paiute Language in High School. We are seeking a partnership with Great Basin Community College to help us obtain these credit statuses.
- **Nov. 23** Hosted a film screening event with filmmaker Travis Hamilton, showing "Touch the Water" at Fox Peak Cinema for Native American Heritage Month.
- Nov 26—Staff attended the YHS Native American Heritage Month Assembly. It was a
  great turnout, with lots of participation and engagement from the YHS NA Club
  students, including the RSIC Eagle Wings Dancers.
- Nov 26 Attended the Grant Writing Training hosted by the NV Governor's Office of Federal Assistance.





We're proud of the team's growth and accomplishments. From improved skills to strong teamwork, the boys have made significant strides.





### **Board of Education**






The Board of Education shall ensure and promote the best possible educational opportunities for all members of the Walker River Paiute Tribe, as well as all community members.
